Blind Ski Program

The Blind Ski program was started in 1963 by Santo Lo Presto and was the only Blind Water Skiing program in the County. Sandy was a highly decorated Hero, a Corporal with a Purple Heart and many war decoration. He was the second most decorated hero in World War II under Audie Murphy. He passed away in March 22, 1989 at 70. He was a great man and a colorful Italian character! Per Sandy "One day a man name Bob left a blind boy at the club and that was the first time I pulled a blind child behind my boat. He didn't stand up too much, but the water was warm and he had a good time." In 1964 the blind child called the club again to ski and that was the start of the Blind Ski Program. They skiers grew to 605 in 24 years. The ages were 4 to 52 years old. Sandy was always promoting and soliciting funds for the program. His favorite saying was "give me a couple of bucks" for my Blind Kids. He was very giving of himself for the blind skiers... he would do anything for them

Ron George (Commodore 1988-89) was the Blind Ski Director after the death of Santo Lo Presto in April 1989. He left the Club for a brief period of time and returned. He has been the Chairperson during 1989-1999 (10 years) and 2007-2018

(11 years) for a total of 22 years. Ron continues as Blind Ski Chairperson. Ron states; "you don't need a boat to volunteer." Help is serving the kids on the beach or helping back at the Club with lunch after the skiing. The program continues during the summer months with 200 participants each year. (continued on page 2)

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Happy Summer, Members!

June was an interesting month, to say the least, at our Club. I'd like to think of it as a "successful failure" for a few reasons. The Club is as busy as it has ever been from an events and overall member usage perspective, which is a great thing. That being the case, several flaws in our operational and planning methods were painfully uncovered, causing inconvenience to our Members. In order to remedy the service issues many of you encountered early in the month, we have hired an additional Galley staff member and have adjusted our staffing plan on weekends to accommodate the increased demand on food and beverage services. We're also asking for your assistance by announcing any plans to bring a large group for Friday night dinner by the Sunday before in order to place a food order to accommodate your guests and other members.

On the business side of things, we seem to have finally turned the corner on our bookkeeping process discovery, and subsequent improvement. Your patience and understanding are, and continue to be, much appreciated as we move forward and onward from the unfortunate circumstances that forced such an abrupt and dramatic change in our accounting staff with absolutely zero ability to transition knowledge from the previous bookkeeper. As always, please do not hesitate to reach out to Kevin Witherell, our Financial Secretary, if you are experiencing any hardship due to our need to play "catch up" from April through June.

As for the Club's future in its current location, I had the opportunity to meet with a group of consultants and members of the Parks and Recreation Department late in the month to begin the baseline requirements for an Environmental Impact Report (EIR). The EIR process itself is a 3-year effort consisting of an initial planning and public input period, followed by a draft EIR that makes its way through various committees and departments, the City Council, and Coastal Commission for approval. This process is currently forecast to take until at least the summer of 2020, and this is just the environmental portion. There will undoubtedly be changes to the proposed use of De Anza as a result of this study, which will add additional time to the overall project and locating a source to pay for all of proposed improvements will also be a challenge. It's impossible to say what is going to happen, but I think we have a minimum of three years of safety in our current location, which is not to say we should be ignoring the fact that we will inevitably have to relocate at some point. We need to continue to explore ways to be proactive on the issue versus waiting for the City to aggressively take action once a plan is finalized and funded. I will keep you updated as to anything further I learn on the matter and please let me or any board member know if you hear anything credible that could have an impact on the Club.

July is going to be another great month, starting with Independence Day Weekend activities. Be sure to check the Club calendar for events!

Special Note for auto pay members: It was brought to our attention by several of our members that the auto payments for member dues had not been charged in April or May. Galley Changes

To all members - The following policy changes are now in effect:

1. The Club, via the Bartenders, are now taking reservations for steak or prime rib (as applicable) that close on Sunday night for the following Friday meal. Have a group of 10? Call ahead of time. Those who make the reservation will have their meal reserved IF YOU SHOW BY 7:30 p.m. (REMEMBER, for the prime rib, the later you show the more the meat will be cooked; meal time 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. would be the preferred time.) We will not hold your steak or prime rib after 7:30 p.m. Galley closes 8:00 p.m. Prime rib is available the first Friday of the Month.
2. If you have a group of ten or more, schedule the function with the bartenders prior to the Sunday of the week in question and they will notify the Galley. There is no charge for small groups and this will alert us of your plans. Knowing the quantity of steaks or prime rib your group wants will help (change to regular menu item can be made with no problem on Friday).
3. After Sunday and you decide at the last minute to come for steak or prime rib, first phone the bartenders to advise of the size of your group with quantity of steaks or prime rib wanted. We will then inform you of food availability.
4. We are changing the food delivery day to Wednesdays from Fridays so that if the delivery truck has a problem we have time to compensate. If the truck is late, it will not then adversely impact food, inventory, and storage issues. This change will incur some added labor costs, but such change being made is so as to not inconvenience you on Friday nights and continue to deliver the quality product that all of us expect.



BOAT STORAGE RULES - Boat Owners

Do not leave personal property on your boat

Please place your 2018 sticker number on your boat. Check and clean up around boats.

We will charge \$20 if you do not clean up of your spaces.

We recommend boat owners do a frequent routine check on boats.

Note: on oil leaks, use plastic dripping pan and kitty litter.

We appreciate your cooperation.

1. All facilities and property are maintained in a safe, functional condition which does not present health or safety hazards to the public, members, visitors or workers. Building materials and non-approved personal property are not authorized to be stored on the SDMBBSC property
2. SDMBBSC is not responsible for any personal items left on the property by members or non-members.
3. Owners of all boats and trailers must maintain a minimum liability insurance policy of \$100,000 (One Hundred-Thousand) for injury to personnel and \$300,000 (Three Hundred-Thousand) for damage to property. The insurance shall list the SDMBBSC as "Additionally Insured" in accordance with SDMBBSC insurance policy.
4. All boat owners with approved storage are responsible to keep his or her property in a clean, operable, and safe condition.
5. Remove weeds and trash around boats regularly. Areas around boat and fence are to be maintained by member. Remove all debris including boat parts, gas and oil cans, and litter.
6. Abandoned vehicles, trailers, boats, jet skis, etc. are not permitted on property. All boats and personal watercrafts must have a current boat registration numbers (CF#) sticker displayed. Boats and trailers are to have current registration and license plates, as mandated by the State ordinances. No boats, cars, trailer, etc. may be stored on blocks. Proof of current Insurance and DMV registration is also required. Vessel and trailer registration stickers must be current on any stored trailer or boat. If a vehicle or trailer does not have properly inflated tires, or a current tag, or has other deficiencies that render it inoperable, it is considered derelict. The storage of derelict vehicles and equipment is prohibited. Vehicle owner shall bring boat, trailer or equipment back to working order unless a waiver is granted by the Board of Directors. After 60 calendar days the equipment, trailer, vehicle or boat will be discarded or towed at owner's expense.
7. Commercial vehicles of any kind are prohibited from being stored in club areas.
8. All Boat Storage Agreements must be current. Boat Storage is limited to Flag Members only and designated Satellite groups.
9. No Fueling or repairing boats on premises.
10. No Fueling or painting of boats on premises. Worn Tie-downs and tarps are to be replaced.
11. No canopies or new sheds are to be moved into the boat yard spaces. Storage lockers are acceptable and are not to exceed 4'(H) x 6'(L) x 3'(W). Member name and membership number shall be listed on the storage locker.
12. Storage of any flammable or hazardous material is prohibited. No liquids of any type may be stored.
13. New member overnight boat storage is allowed with approval of the Boat Yard Chairman. They must have the proper paperwork, pay all fees and be a member of the Club.
14. Wash down boats on the boat ramp. Avoid washing gravel and debris into Rose Creek.
15. Always bag fish waste before disposing in dumpster.
16. Do not use boatyard electric power continuously—such as charging batteries.
17. Shut water off and coil hoses neatly when finished using.
