The enthusiastic new and committed Board of Directors for 2020 were installed.

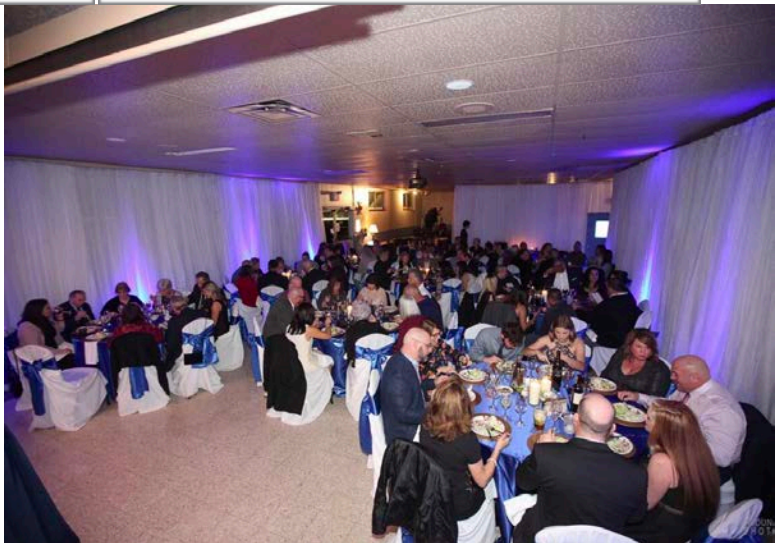
The evening highlights was the announcements of :

***** SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT - BATHROOM UPGRADE/RENOVATION PROJECT ONE TIME \$50 ASSESSMENT *****

At the January board meeting, the board approved a motion to move forward with the 2020 Bathroom Upgrade/Renovation. The floors in both bathrooms, and the hallway will be completely replaced. In addition, both the Women's and Men's bathrooms will receive all new partitions, and the Men's room will take on a slightly different configuration as part of the overall project. In order to help fund this project all flag members will be receiving a one-time, \$50 assessment on their March invoice. Please let me know if you have any questions/concerns regarding this very important project, or the one-time assessment.



In the last Scuttlebutt, I talked about the restroom remodel that would have already been completed by now. But that project was put on hold at the last minute due to membership concern voiced at the bar, on the Sunday prior to commencement of the work the following Monday. Under normal circumstances, the work should not have been stopped at the last moment and also normally, the various concerns should have been voiced at the Flag meeting where the membership has a full voice on projects at the Club.

However At the Flag meeting on 21 Jan, the project was again fully addressed and the Board made decisions. The approved work will now begin on January 27. What will the finalized restrooms look like? Due to the need for a restroom for the wheelchair bound and the concerns of the membership, the men's restroom will become gender neutral when needed (the door will have a lock when used by other than male personnel). For this room, the one remaining urinal will be lowered, toilet repositioned, new partition, new floor, new sink, new mirror, light switch and towel racks repositioned, and grab bars installed. For the ladies' room, the change will be a new floor and new partitions. The two stalls will remain but there will be new partitions. Due to the state of funds at the Club, this will be at a minor cost to the membership (see Commodore comments), but this change is absolutely necessary so as to comply with various laws and provide comfort to guests and members.

The hallway floors between the Galley and the restrooms will also be replaced at the same time. Work is scheduled to commence early in the morning and stop about the time the Club is opened for business each day. The work is scheduled for one week, each restroom, and available for the weekends per current work schedules. To everyone that this will impact during the construction process, I thank you in advance for any difficulties this may cause. I am sure you understand the need.

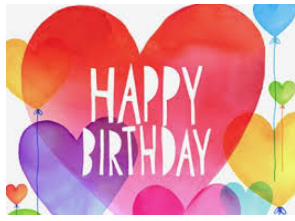

Mission Bay Aquatic Park dedicated 70 years ago
The San Diego Union, Sunday, Sept. 4, 1949

Seventy years ago, a 3-day festival was held over Labor Day weekend, Sept. 3-5, 1949, to officially open Mission Bay Park. The Fiestabahia, or Bay Festival, celebrated the \$20 million Mission Bay development. "Colorful Program Marks Opening of Fiestabahia." Thousands See Mission Bay's Aquatic Show. Mission Bay was the star of its own show in the first day's performance of Fiestabahia. After a week of being wrapped in cotton batten, the sun came out to make the water a bright blue, and there was enough wind for smooth, easy sailing.

The result of this good behavior was that thousands of people who lounged along the bay's beaches, watching one event after another, had a chance to see what a pleasure resort this aquatic park can be. Cars started arriving on the grounds right after breakfast. At no time in the afternoon was the stream of traffic heavy enough to prevent normal progress. It was not until the night show that traffic became thick, but soon after dark the chain of headlights was solid stretching back from the new Ventura Bridge to Midway Drive. By the first splash in the Buster Crabbe's "Aqua Parade," 4,000 seats had been sold to spectators eager to see the combination of stage acts, swimmers, divers and lights that has made it famous.

The Missionettes San Diego swimming and paddleboard girls drew an enthusiastic round of applause for their skillfully executed figures. The first Crabbe show had been over only a few minutes when searchlights picked up the dangling figure of Douglas Gee, parachute jumper who will make leaps over the channel each night of the celebration at 8:45 pm. Likewise after the last "Aqua-parade" show the crowd was treated to a half hour of fireworks shot into the air from Ventura Point. Thousands sat spellbound and quiet, not only in the Fiesta grounds, but all around the bay as the sky was lighted by the display.

CHANNEL CROWDED: From mid-morning until dusk, the main channel between Gleason Point and Tierra del Fuego was used by every conceivable type of water navigation. Some craft vied in trophy races and others just sailed or sputtered for the fun of it. Later in the afternoon still another type of craft moved on the water, when the "strolling troubadours" took to flower-bedecked barges designed after the world-famed barges of Xochimilco in Mexico. Throughout the day, the thickest crowd was around the Main Stage, where bleachers had been erected for the National Swimming and Diving Championships and for the Missionettes water ballet and Buster Crabbe's "Aqua Parade of 1949." From this vantage the Fiestabahia was like a three-ring circus, with activities both close to the shore and beyond, in the main bay channel.

OTHERS ELSEWHERE: But for every man, woman or child at the Main Stage, there were two elsewhere in the vast entertainment area. A sizable number managed to keep off land a good part of the time, either by riding in private boats or plying back and forth in the big water taxis brought from San Diego Bay.

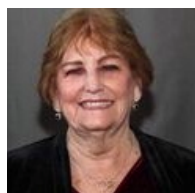
